A graduate of the Enfield Public Schools must have earned a minimum of 22 credits, must have met the established credit distribution requirement, and must have earned a 4.0 (C-) average for all courses required for graduation. In accordance with Connecticut General Statutes, students must also meet additional performance standards. Beginning with the graduating class of 2006, literacy and numeracy performance standards shall be required with an ultimate goal to improve learning for every student. Starting with the class of 2016, a science performance standard shall be required.

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In the future, additional performance standards may be considered.

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Students who have earned more than the required credits for graduation but failed to obtain the required 4.0 (C-) average, may attempt to satisfy the 4.0 (C-) average by calculating the highest GPA using the minimum number of credits. Such calculation must include all of the required courses.

Only students who have met all of the district's graduation requirements may participate in their school's graduation ceremony.

Non-Graduating Seniors:

Seniors who have not satisfied all requirements for graduation will not be allowed to participate in the school's graduation ceremony and will be given the opportunity to attain a high school diploma by:

- a. attending summer school at their own expense in an attempt to meet the graduation requirements.
- b. returning to high school the following year to meet all graduation requirements.

All students must pass a minimum of four (4) full-credit courses in their senior year. This requirement may be waived for students who have been granted approval for senior mid-year graduation or have returned to complete their graduation requirements.

Students who have met all of the district's graduation requirements except for the literacy and/or numeracy standard shall receive a certificate of completion in lieu of a high school diploma.

Senior Mid-Year Graduation:

Students who complete all graduation requirements by the end of the second marking period of the senior year, may select to leave school at that time provided they have complied with the following procedures:

- A formal request must be made to the school administration, before the end of the junior year. This request must be made on the official "Early Graduation Request Form" which can be obtained from the Guidance Office.
- The request for Mid-Year Graduation must have the approval of the parent or guardian. The student's guidance counselor will certify that the student is eligible for early graduation.
- A program must be planned accordingly prior to the end of the Junior year.
- Final and official approval must be obtained from the school administration.

Principals should use discretion in granting permission for early graduation and weigh each request on its own merits. Consideration should be given to requests centered around such things as:

- a. Early acceptance into college or some other acceptable educational or vocational program.
- b. Extreme economic hardship within a family.

Since the Board feels that a student's high school experience is beneficial both academically and socially, it will not be the intent of this policy to encourage students to request early graduation simply for the purpose of seeking an early termination to their formal education process.

Students who have been granted permission for mid-year graduation will receive their diplomas in June and are expected to participate in commencement activities. All graduation expenses and obligations should be met before leaving school.

5. All other requests for early graduation other than those stipulated above will require the approval of the Superintendent of Schools. In no case will students be permitted to "graduate" earlier than the end of the "junior" year.

E. Transfer of Credits:

Students who transfer to the senior high school in their senior year will receive an Enfield diploma provided such transfer is made on or before February 1st. In cases where students transfer after February 1st, the administration shall make an effort to have the student receive a diploma from the school last attended. In any case, students in this category shall participate in Enfield graduation ceremonies.

High school students may take courses and earn credits from any accredited college, vocational institution or accredited/approved Distance Learning Program at their own expense. Such courses may be added to the student's official school transcript and applied toward fulfilling graduation requirements. The number of course credits, which will be accepted toward graduation requirements, is not to exceed two credits.

Students pursuing this option, must obtain approval from the guidance office and school principal prior to enrolling in any such course.

The decision of the principal is final.

F. Special Education Students:

Special Education students will be subject to the general policy regarding graduation unless extenuating circumstances are in evidence, which might exclude such students from satisfactorily completing the district performance standards and/or the grading policy as determined by the Planning and Placement Team (P.P.T.).

It is expected that the P.P.T. will recommend "exemptions" from this Board policy as early in the program planning stage as may be feasible but after the student has participated in the CAPT assessment.

G. <u>Modifications and Accommodations</u>:

Students who have been identified as ESL/ELL may be allowed modifications or accommodations by a school review committee in order to meet any of the conditions set forth in the performance standards section. The review committee may exempt such students if, in the opinion of the committee, they deem the language barriers to be a significant impediment to satisfying the conditions set forth in Section C.1.

Annual Organization Meeting of the Board:

The Board of Education shall be organized at its first regularly scheduled meeting or at a Special Meeting held within the time limits set by law following the biennial election. The meeting shall be called to order by the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or the Secretary of the Board for the preceding year, in that order of priority, provided one of these officers is still a member of the Board. If none of the former officers is still a member of the Board, the meeting shall be called to order by the Town Clerk. The person calling the meeting to order shall preside until a chairperson is chosen.

The new Chairperson of the Board shall take office upon election. The Board shall then elect a Vice-Chairperson and a Secretary.

All officers of the Board shall hold office for a term of two years until their successors are elected and have qualified, except in case of removal as herein provided.

Whenever there is a vacancy in the office of Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Secretary, the Board shall elect a new officer to fill the vacancy during the unexpired term of office. Such election shall take place at the next regularly scheduled meeting following the effective date of termination.

Election of Officers - Nominations will be received from the floor. A majority of five (5) votes of the members of the Board shall be required for election.

<u>Public: Executive Session</u> - All meetings of the Board for the official transaction of business shall be open to the public. The Board may at its discretion, meet in executive session to discuss confidential matters. Such action to go into executive session shall be voted and in accord with Connecticut State Statutes.²

<u>Minutes</u> - All motions of the Board shall be recorded in the minute book of the Board. The votes of each member of the Board upon any motion requiring role call vote, shall be recorded in the minutes. The minute book shall be kept on file as the permanent official record of all Board action and shall be open to inspection of the public unless such inspection would:

a. adversely affect the public security or the financial interests of the Town of Enfield, or

b. be injurious to the reputation or character of a person.

Denial of the right of inspection shall be in writing generally stating the reason therefore.

6. BOARD GUEST(S)

a. Dr. Joseph Erardi, Newton Public School Superintendent and Chair of the CAPSS Federal Relations Committee

Dr. Schumann introduced Dr. Erardi, the Newton Superintendent to the Board. He is also the Chair for the CAPSS Federal Relations Committee.

Dr. Erardi thanked the Board for the invitation. As you all know, when this committee is together, we are working hard for advocacy that influences National Education Policies. Dr. Schumann is one of three superintendents that represent Connecticut when we go to Washington DC. We are making relationships with our Federal Delegation. He feels it is important to share with the Board what we are doing as members of the Federal Relations Committee. He is privileged to sit as an Executive Committee member for this delegation. Dr. Schumann has an outstanding relationship with Senator Joe Courtney. Our work is important for the betterment of schools systems across the country. We work long hours and help to create legislation. We are proud of our work.

Chairman Sirard thanked Dr. Erardi for coming.

8. AUDIENCES

Rebecca Kalagher – Mrs. Kalagher stated she is here about the transition team and would like an update on this. There are many areas that need to be addressed like class offerings and scheduling. Will more AP classes be offered? Will students be able to receive unofficial transcripts and what will this look like? What about class rank? She is also concerned about the music wing not being ready until February/March 2016. Many other parents are concerned about the band room and will it be able to hold everyone. What about the uniforms. Our students are currently competing and are working very hard. How will this all work out? Students are applying to colleges with music as their majors. Are we doing a disservice to them if the rooms are not ready? Band uniforms need to be ordered. We have a great music and academic program that is weighted. Will the auditorium be large enough for the graduating class in case it rains? Thank you.

9. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. Grady congratulated Enfield High Student Tory Orefice for being recognized as one of the 2016 the National Merit Scholarship Program winners.

Mr. Grady addressed the Board about a fund raising program called the "Sunshine Kids Club" that benefits kids with cancer. They are looking to raise \$5K. He would like us to place this on the website. This fund raiser is for a great cause and he supports it.

Mr. Grady added that he participated at ShopRite for "Bagging for Hunger" with Mr. Peabody and Mrs. Unghire. He had a good time and met many people. He would like to correct this problem in our town.

Mrs. LeBlanc attended the JFK Curriculum night for grade 6 students. The clubs and late buses at JFK have started. She also attended the EHS Curriculum night. She cannot wait for them to be using the new science wing.

Mrs. LeBlanc attended the JV Football game at Enfield High and two Eagles flew over the field. We were all excited about the Eagles. This was very symbolic.

Mrs. LeBlanc added that our roads are being done by Spazzarini Construction Company and they are doing a great job.

Mrs. LeBlanc agreed with Mrs. Kalagher that we need to get the transition information out to the parents. Mr. Longey addressed parent concerns before the Curriculum night at EHS. This was very helpful to the EHS parents. She agrees the parents have a lot of questions that need to be addressed. Thank you for your valued points you mentioned tonight. You opened our eyes to many different things.

Mr. Neville stated a lot has been happening with the transition. The Superintendent has a list to discuss with us tonight. Some things have been decided and some items still need to be addressed. Some of the items will be discussed at the Curriculum meetings. Some of the concerns involve money. We need to figure out a way to address these one-time costs with the Town Council. He apologized for not being open with this to the public. This item will be addressed tonight and at the next several upcoming Board meetings.

Mr. Neville stated that class offerings are tied to budgets and scheduling. Once they are combined, there will be more offerings for students. This will not be perfect. We are offering our students more AP classes now. If you have any other questions, please call us.

Mrs. Thurston stated Eli Whitney will hold their welcome back picnic. They will also hold their first PTO meeting on October 7^{th} .

Mr. Jonaitis stated the Board met prior to the Board meeting and we discussed the transition plans and music. He added that we are moving forward with this and everything is on schedule at this time.

Mr. Jonaitis stated the topic of the casino in Enfield has energized people. This is what needs to be done when we decide about Fermi. Referendum items will need to be decided this election. We could use Fermi as a middle school, as an alternative education program, vocational education program and many other things. We could draw students from the surrounding towns. Don't just let this building sit there and deteriorate. There are many reasons why students act out in class. We have a great alternative program at Alcorn that is working because of the small student to teacher ratios. Alternative education is a win-win for everyone.

Mr. Jonaitis hopes that the Board can finally put to bed the Superintendent's Evaluation. This has gone on way too long.

Mr. Jonaitis stated he made several requests through the chair that have not been addressed yet. He is now asking again through the chair about a parent addressed the Board several months ago about walkers taking the bus during the winter months. They are looking for the Board to approve students walking to the nearest bus stop. He also asked if a student makes up work during the summer could it be counted. He still has not received an answer about this. He reminded Board members that Central Office works for us not the other way.

Mr. Jonaitis stated during the Meet the Candidates Night you should ask questions and hold candidates to it. Ask tough pertinent questions. Candidates need to live up this.

Mr. Peabody recognized several past students for their accomplishments. Our school system has produced some success stories.

Mr. Peabody stated the ERfC program offers a safe place for kids before and after school. They can do their homework and they offer programs for our kids. This is a great program for our kids. They held a backpack drive and received many items for students.

Mr. Peabody thanked our PTO's for doing a great job and supporting our kids. He urged parents to get involved with their PTO at their child's school.

Mr. Peabody attended Family Day and had a great time. This was their 18th year holding this event on the Town Green.

Mr. Peabody stated our buildings and grounds are responsible for our school grounds. He would like to know the condition of our schools. He requested from the chair to Dr. Schumann to obtain a schedule of inspections for the play grounds and the repairs that are needed. Eli Whitney playground has been closed for repairs. Some of the rest rooms at Barnard need to be looked at. He would Board members to have some building walkthroughs. Some of the walls at Barnard and Nathan Hale need fresh paint.

Mr. Peabody requested from the chair to Dr. Schumann to look into storage for classroom materials being stored at Alcorn. Some of our teachers are buying their own materials. Can we let the teachers know about this storage area at Alcorn?

Mr. Peabody requested from the chair to Dr. Schumann if there is any excess equipment at any of the schools, we should let the other schools know so they can use it. Some of the desks need to be replaced.

Mr. Peabody thanked Mrs. Kalagher for speaking tonight about our music programs. We will look into the academic programs.

Mr. Peabody requested from the chair to Dr. Schumann that the Building Committee put up a FAQ page on the website. Questions could be answered here for parents. He stated that we discussed the transition tonight. We will continue to look into alternatives.

Mrs. Unghire thanked Mrs. Kalagher for your concerns.

Mrs. Unghire stated that Hazardville Memorial held a picnic and the turnout was great. She attended a CREC meeting in Hartford. She attended Family Day and everyone had a great time. She spoke to members of EFFE & KITE at the Family Day. She thanked everyone involved with the "Bagging for Hunger" event at ShopRite. She also thanked the Miller family at ShopRite for everything they do for our community.

Mrs. Unghire attended the Rachel's Challenge event at Fermi. She was there from 8-2 PM. It was truly amazing and very powerful program. Mr. Newton asked that each one, reach one. She added that Andrew, Lily and Hannah, you rock.

EHS Student Representative added that the busing and parking continue to be a big concern at Enfield High. There are currently two buses that are extremely overcrowded in the Thompsonville area. Walkers are taking the buses. There are some buses like the one she rides that only have a few students on it. She would like something to be done about this, maybe we could send some of these empty buses to this area to pick up the students.

Chairman Sirard thanked Dr. Erardi for attending tonight's meeting. He has had the privilege of lobbying with Dr. Schumann also.

Chairman Sirard stated the transition information has been slow coming. Information will now be forthcoming. The builders are doing a great job and they are currently on time with the project. The administration is handling the transition professionally and it will be forthcoming.

Chairman Sirard addressed Mrs. Kalagher by stated both the auditorium and gymnasium will be air-conditioned.

11. NEW BUSINESS

a. Transition Update and Action, if any

Dr. Schumann reviewed and distributed a memo about the high school consolidation transition and timeline. The project is currently on schedule. Uniforms will cost around \$230K - \$250K for the entire school. We need to order items for the Band during the winter and items for fall athletics in the spring. This is a starting point for a transition budget.

Mr. Neville stated we need to expedite the uniforms with the Town Council. We need to discuss this item quickly and do not have the luxury to wait.

Mr. Neville requested from the chair to Dr. Schumann for this be discussed at the next Governance meeting. This is not in our budget and needs to be addressed sooner rather than later. We can even hold a joint meeting if needed to discuss this.

Chairman Sirard stated we will address this at the next Governance meeting.

Mr. Peabody asked when the next Governance is meeting. Dr. Schumann stated we will first need to establish if this process will continue with the Interim Town Manager and Mayor.

Mr. Peabody requested from the chair to the Dr. Schumann for this discussion to be held in the next few weeks. We have some quotes to start with. We also need to look at what can be done concurrently. Some items can be sent to the Policy and Curriculum Committees to speed up the process.

Mr. Grady asked who decides on the band uniforms. Dr. Schumann stated the band directors and Dr. Goodnite have spoken to a company and have mockups. We can show the Board if they would like to view one of them. There is no policy in place that prohibits the Board or the Administration to make decisions regarding uniforms.

Mr. Grady does not believe the Board should make this decision.

Mr. Jonaitis would like the students to decide. Remember what we went through with the mascot.

Mrs. LeBlanc added the Enfield High Uniforms just say Enfield. We might not need to order everything.

Dr. Schumann stated the new uniforms would include the new school colors. He is sure we could use some of the older uniforms but would not have enough for all of the programs.

Mrs. LeBlanc stated that students from both EHS and FHS would like to purchase the older uniforms. This could be a revenue source for the new uniforms.

Dr. Schumann stated the uniforms are Board equipment and this could be discussed by the Policy Committee.

Chairman Sirard would like this to be referred to the Policy Committee.

Mr. Grady asked who made the decision for the band uniforms at Fermi. Mrs. Kalagher stated the band director and Dr. Goodnite.

Mr. Neville requested from the Chair to Dr. Schumann it might take up to 6 months to hire a new Town Manager.

Chairman Sirard is confident that he and Dr. Schumann can set up a meeting with the Town Manager and Mayor.

Mr. Neville added that money is never an easy issue to deal with. This needs to be discussed now. The Board and Town Council need to discuss this. We need to order the uniforms in January/March. We can look at the old uniforms to see what we can use. We don't want to do this part of the consolidation poorly.

Chairman Sirard would like Dr. Schumann to set a meeting with the Mayor and acting Town Manager.

Mr. Neville would like them to meet at least once or twice a month to get this done. You can also delegate items to us in order to get this done as quickly as possible.

Chairman Sirard stated this will jump start the process.

Mr. Peabody stated that he previously asked for a transition budget to discuss one-time costs with the Town Council. If we had done this before, we wouldn't be scrambling now. He believes we will have a new high school and need new uniforms to go with the new school pride. He doesn't want to see the music program with old uniforms. Music is near and dear to his heart.

Mrs. Thurston added that no one wants to see us with old uniforms.

Mr. Jonaitis stated to help with the costs the JV and Freshman teams when and where possible the teams can use some of the older uniforms.

Mrs. LeBlanc stated bringing our students together is the top priority. We will be dealing with scheduling and other transition issues. We can save money where we can and use some of the older uniforms for JV and Freshman teams. Band uniforms are a big expense and she would like to see the money for this. We want our students to be happy. There will be some bumps along the road that we will need to deal with. The success of our students is important.

Mr. Neville would like to see the administration recommend to us what is needed. If additional meetings are needed, we can schedule that. This is a big deal. Let the people that are doing the research bring the information back to us.

Mr. Peabody agrees. Let the Music and Band Director make the decision about the uniforms. We should only approve the funding for this.

Dr. Schumann distributed a memo to the Board regarding a contingency plan if there are any construction delays that might prohibit the merger of the two high schools to take place in September 2016. This memo will go to the CIAC and we will ask for the two schools to be allowed to compete in the Central Connecticut Conference as the Enfield High School Eagles in the event that the merger does not take place in September 2016 due to unforeseen construction delays. We are hopeful that there will be no construction delays, but need to put a plan in place for just in case. We need to notify the CIAC about the merger by October 1, 2015. We are formally making a request for permission to merge the athletic programs for our two high schools for the 2016-17 school year.

Mr. Peabody moved, seconded by Mrs. Thurston that the Enfield Board of Education approves the CIAC document as presented by Dr. Schumann.

Discussion:

Mr. Jonaitis would like a moment for the Board to read the memo.

Mr. Neville stated this is going to give us an insurance policy for just in case. You are doing your due diligence in case of any unforeseen construction issues. He will vote in favor of this document.

Mr. Peabody stated this is well written document that will assure that our students will have the opportunity to compete. He will vote in favor of this also.

A vote by **roll-call 8-0-0** passed unanimously.

Mr. Peabody asked how this letter will be sent to the CIAC since tomorrow is October 1st. Dr. Schumann stated we will e-mail and will send it out by certified mail to the CIAC.

12. BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. Curriculum Committee

Mr. Neville reported the Curriculum Committee met on August 24th. We discussed technology, report card changes and curriculum changes. We will be discussing technology with the Board at a later date. We have revised the elementary K-2 report cards and have responded to the parent's concerns. We also reviewed the summer curriculum writing. We will discuss with the Board about the ACC Partnership with the middle school and high school. We discussed the high school curriculum implications with the consolidation. This will also be discussed with the Board.

Mr. Peabody added the parents that participated were amazed and pleased that the Curriculum Committee asked for their input. Kindergarten report cards amaze him now with how much the students need to know. He looks forward to doing this more with parents.

Mr. Jonaitis asked who gave input on the update K-2 report cards. Mr. Neville stated the Academic office met with principals and the teachers.

b. Building Committee

Mr. Neville reported the Building Committee met on September 25th. The Board discussed the transition prior to tonight's Board meeting. The Transition Committee will meet next week with Dr. Schumann. Storage is a huge concern. We are looking to use part of Stowe or Hazardville Memorial.

Dr. Schumann added that there is some space at both Stowe and Alcorn that could be used.

Mr. Neville asked if there will be space at Memorial. Dr. Schumann stated that may be possible also.

Mr. Neville stated communication was discussed. Posters have been made about the rooms at EHS. This will be shared with parents and information will be posted on-line.

13. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Grady moved, seconded by Mrs. Thurston that the Special Meeting Minutes of September 14, 2015 be approved. A vote by **show-of-hands 5-0-3** passed with Mr. Grady, Mr. Jonaitis and Mr. Peabody abstaining.

Mr. Grady moved, seconded by Mrs. Thurston that the Regular Meeting Minutes of September 15, 2015 be approved. A vote by **show-of-hands 7-0-1** passed with Mr. Neville abstaining.
