Budget Adjustment Worksheet

On January 13, 2015 the Superintendent proposed a spending plan for the 2015-2016 school year in the amount of \$69,886,938. This represents an 8.75% increase to the 2014-2015 budget allocation. Presented on the first row of the table below are the data for the Superintendent's proposed spending plan. Each row beneath are the data to understand the reductions required to attain that level of increase. The attached pages list the cost and impact of several budgetary items as requested by the Board.
